October 5th SAINT MARY FAUSTINA KOWALSKA

Saint Mary Faustina was born in Glogowiec in Poland August 25th, 1905. She was the third of ten children born to a poor, devout peasant family. She was baptized in the parish church with the name

Helena. She attended school for three years and at the age of nine she made her first holy communion. From an early age she wanted to enter a convent, but the parents did not give their permission and she worked as housekeeper supporting herself and her family. August 1st, 1925 she had a vision of the suffering Christ and entered the congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy taking the name Mary Faustina. She spent the rest of her life, only 13 years in the Congregation's houses as cook, gardener and porter. Sister Mary Faustina exterior demeanor hid the extraordinary union with God. She based her spirituality on the mystery of the Mercy of God, which she saw in the word of God as well as in her everyday life. Prompted by a direct revelation, she dedicated herself to cooperating with God's mercy in the task of saving souls. She proclaimed to the world about God's mercy for the all humans particularly for sinners. She reminded to display an attitude of child-like trust in God, which expresses itself in fulfilling His Will, and show mercy toward one's neighbour. From the beginning of its existence the Church preached the mercy of God and God in His Divine Mercy gave us Sister Mary Faustina as a reminder of it. Sister Mary Faustina suffered from tuberculosis and other ailments. She died at the age of 33 on October 5, 1939. She was beatified April 18th, 1993 by Pope John Paul II and was canonized by him April 30th, 2000. The Sunday after Easter was proclaimed "Divine Mercy Sunday" in the year 2000.

FEAST OF THE MOST HOLY ROSARY

His Holiness Pope Leo XII decreed that the month of October be called the month of the Most Holy Rosary. Tradition asserts that, after St. Dominic implored the holy Mother of God to enlighten him



how he could bring about the conversion of misguided souls for whom her Divine Son had laid down His life, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to him holding a rosary and instructed him how to say it.

When the Mohammedans were threatening to overrun Christian Europe, Pope Pius V asked all Christians to recite the Holy Rosary for the success of the Christian Arms, and ordered all Churches to conduct Devotions with public processions and recitation of the Rosary. On Sunday, October 7, 1571, Don Johann of Austria gained naval victory over the Turkish fleet at Lepano, while processions of the confraternities of the Holy Rosary were taking place in Rome. Don Johann of Austria ascribed the victory to the powerful intercession of the Queen of the Most Holy Rosary. In thanksgiving St. Pius V declared October 7th, the Feast of the most Holy Rosary.

October 10th *ST. DANIEL COMBONI* Patron of Missionaries, Aid Workers and our newest elementary school.

Daniel Comboni was boron March 15th, 1831, at Limone sul Garda (Brescia - Italy). His parents

Luigi and Domenica were cultivators working for a rich local proprietor. Daniel was fourth of eight children, but the only child that survived infancy. They were a close family unit, rich in faith and human values, but poor in material things. Poverty forces Daniel to go away to school in Verona, in the Institute founded by Father Nicola Mazza. During the years spent in Verona, Daniel discovers his calling to the priesthood and the love for Africa. He completed his studies of Philosophy and Theology and was ordained in 1854. Three years later he left for Africa along with five other missionaries with the blessing of his mother, who finally tells him: "Go, Daniel, and may the Lord bless you". Four months later the missionaries arrived in Khartoum, Sudan. Daniel is immediately made aware of the multiple difficulties that are part of his new mission. He saw his fellow missionaries die. Life was hard, but Daniel was driven by the thought that one sweats and dies for love of Jesus Christ and the salvation of the most abandoned souls in the world. Confident that Africans will become the leading agents of their own evangelisation, he launches a project designed to "Save Africa through Africa" His endeavours are great on other fronts too, for example in his tireless struggle for the abolition of slavery. In 1877 he is consecrated Bishop and named Vicar Apostolic of Central Africa. He died in Khartoum October 10th, 1881, worn out by his toils and his crosses. On October 5th, 2003, he was canonised by John Paul II.

Oh Father, who through Saint Daniel Comboni have shown us a marvellous example of love for You and the peoples of Africa, grant that through his intercession we too may be transformed by the love which flows from the Pierced Heart of the Good Shepherd. Amen
