SAINT ANDREW DUNG-LAC & COMPANIONS

Martyrs

Through missionaries beginning in the 16th century and continuing until 1886, the

Vietnamese people heard the message of the Gospel, and many accepted the Christian Faith despite persecution and even death. Sts. Andrew Dung-Lac and Peter Thi, Vietnamese priests, were beheaded December 21, 1839. In the 18th century 117 people were martyred. They were canonized and are Saints of the Church. 96 Martyrs were Vietnamese; 37 of them priests and 59 lay people of every state in life. 21 Martyrs were from Spain and France; among them were 8 bishops and 13 priests. These martyrs gave their lives not only for the Church but for Vietnam as well.

O God, the fount and origin of all fatherhood, You enabled the blessed Martyrs Andrew and his companions to be faithful to the Cross of Your Son even unto the shedding of their blood. Grant through their intercession that we may spread Your love among our brothers and sisters and not only be called, but truly be Your children Amen.

ST. CATHERINE OF ALEXANDRIA

Martyr. Patron of librarians, teachers and students.

St. Catherine was born into Alexandrian nobility in the 4th century and was an educated women. After learning about the Christian Faith from the successors of Pantaenus of



Alexandria and his disciple St. Clement, she glorified God by her confession of the Faith of Christ under the Emperor Maximinus II, who persecuted Christians. She did not fear to throw her rank on the side of the oppressed Church and contemned the doings of the tyrant Maximinus. After much persecution she was sent into exile, were she was visited by the Empress and the leader of the armed forces. She converted both to Christianity for which she and they were martyred. After vain attempts by means of torture by being strapped to a spiked wheel to force her to renounce her Faith, Catherine was beheaded.

Lord Jesus Christ, You gave St. Catherine of Alexandria the grace and strength to withstand all pain and suffering. By her martyrdom, may we, like her remain constant in faith. Amen.

Since the end of the coronavirus pandemic is not in sight, holding our regular fundraising events is impossible and so our parish



Next week we enter the new Liturgical Year, Cycle "B".

The liturgical year starts with the first Sunday of Advent and takes us through all the mysteries of God's divine plan for our salvation.



In the season of Advent we are told by Jesus to be watchful, hear John

the Baptist's call for repentance, and hear the announcement by the Angel Gabriel that Mary our Holy Mother will conceive by the Holy Spirit a son and will call Him Jesus. After Advent we start the season of Christmas. Christ's birth and Jesus' early years, We celebrate the Holy Family and Mary, Mother of God, and hear about the Three Wise Man who came from the Far East and worshiped Baby Jesus.

For a short period we are in Ordinary Time preparing us for Lent. Lent should remind us about our sinfulness and to repent Lent ends with the Triduum, starting with Jesus leaving Himself in the Holy Eucharist followed by His suffering, His death on the cross. The Easter season starts with His glorious resurrection, His ascension into heaven and the coming of the Holy Spirit. The longest period in the liturgical year, is the time called ordinary time. There is nothing ordinary about this time because we hear about Christ's great love for us. His miracles, His forgiveness extended to sinners, His teaching with authority, which means teaching by example. We hear Him inviting us to follow Him and to act like Him. Hearing how Jesus lived His live we realize, we know, that Christ is King. Therefore at the end of the ordinary time, which is also the end of the liturgical year, we celebrate this knowledge, by celebrating the Feast of Christ the King.
