OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE Patroness of the Americas



On Dec.9, 1531, at Guadalupe, on the outskirts of Mexico City, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to an Indian convert, Juan

Diego, and left with him a picture of herself impressed upon his cloak. This cloak is preserved in the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe, near Mexico City.

Devotion to Mary under this title has continually increased and today she is the Patroness of the Americas. Because of the close link between the Church in Mexico and the United States this feast was placed on the American Calendar. Juan Diego was canonized by Pope John Paul II in 2002. His feast day is celebrated December 9th,

God, in Your concern and love for Your people You favored the New World with the appearance of Mary, Mother of Jesus, at Guadalupe. Help the countries of this New World to live with one another in peace, unity, and brotherhood. Set Your justice in our hearts that Your peace will reign in all the world. Amen.

The Tradition of the Advent Wreath

The Advent wreath is a popular symbol of the beginning of the Church year in churches as well as homes. It is a circular evergreen wreath (real or artificial) with five candles, four around the wreath and one in the centre.

The wreath is symbolic and there are various ways to understand the symbolism. The exact meaning given to the various aspects of the wreath is not as important as the story to which it invites us to listen, and participate.

The circle of the wreath reminds us of God Himself, His eternity and His endless mercy, which has no beginning or end.

The green of the wreath speaks of the hope that we have in God, the hope of newness, of renewal, of eternal life.

The candles, traditionally 3 purple, one pink and one white, symbolize the light of God coming into the world through the birth of His son. The four outer candles represent the period of waiting during the four Sundays of Advent, which themselves symbolize the four centuries of waiting between the prophet Malachi and the birth of Christ.

The first candle traditionally symbolizes our Expectation and Hope. The second candle represents Peace, the third candle, the pink one, Joy and the forth candle Love. The white centre candle is called the Christ Candle and is lit on Christmas Eve. It reminds us that Christ is the centre of the season.
