THE CONVERSION OF SAINT PAUL Apostle

St. Paul, was born at Tarsus, Cilicia of Jewish parents, disentrance of the tribe of Benjamin. Paul was a Roman citizen from birth. He was of the



ancestral Law. As a convinced and sent to Jerusalem to complete his schooling. There he was educated in the strict observance zealous Pharisee he returned to Tarsis before Jesus Christ began His public life. Sometime after the death of our Lord St. Paul returned to Palestine and because of his profound conviction and emotional character he fanatically persecuted the infant Christian Church. He took part in the stoning of the first Martyr, St. Stephen and in the fierce persecution of Christians that followed. The high priest entrusted him with a mission to go to Damascus and arrest all Christians there and bring them bound back to Jerusalem. As he was nearing Damascus a great light from heaven shone around him and he heard Jesus' voice asking him why he is persecuting him. Still known as Saul, St. Paul turned away from his apparent successful career to become a follower of Christ. He was baptized became known as Paul and became an Apostle and teacher of the Christian Faith.

God our Father, You taught the Gospel to all the world through the preaching of Paul Your Apostle. May we who celebrate his conversion to the faith follow him in bearing witness to Your truth. Amen.

SAINTS TIMOTHY & TITUS Bishops



ST. TIMOTHY was born of a Greek father and a Jewish mother. He was educated in the reading of the Scriptures. Timothy, his mother, grandmother probably embraced the Christian Faith during the first visit of St. Paul in Lystra. On St. Paul's second visit, Timothy was highly recommended by the

Christians and so the Apostle chose him as a missionary companion. St. Paul sent him often on difficult and secret missions. During the first imprisonment of the Apostle at Rome, St. Timothy was with him, his master. After their release he accompanied St. Paul on his last missionary journey and was left in Ephesus to take charge of the Church there, where according to tradition he spent the rest of his life as Bishop. He was martyred, (stoned to death,) during the winter of the year 97.

ST. TITUS was a friend and disciple of St. Paul, who ordained him Bishop of Crete. About the year 56 St. Paul sent him to Corinth to reform the Church there. St. Titus was the most cherished disciple of St. Paul. St. Titus accompanied St. Paul and St.



Barnabas to the Council of Jerusalem. This council insisted that he submit himself to the rite of circumcision, but St. Paul refused to permit it. St. Titus returned to Crete to exercise his Episcopal office and died there about the year 96 of old age.

God our Father, You gave Your Saints Timothy and Titus the courage and wisdom of the apostles: may their prayers help us to live holy lives and lead us to heaven, our true home. Amen.
