June 13th SAINT ANTHONY OF PADUA

St. Anthony was a native of Lisbon, Portugal, where he was born in 1195. He received the name Ferdinand at baptism. He was educated by the Order of regular Canons of St. Augustine and joined them at the age of 15. After 2 years he was sent to the convent of the Holy Cross where he was for 8 years, when the

relics of five Franciscan martyrs were brought from Morocco to Portugal. This inspired St. Anthony to follow into the footsteps of these heroes of Faith. He obtained permission to pass over to the Franciscan Order. He was on his way to preach in Africa, but severe illness forced him to return. Winds drove the vessel to Sicily and the desire to see St. Francis took him from there to Assisi. After teaching for many years in Bologna, Toulouse and Padua, he devoted himself to the work of preaching. Through his sermons he saved many souls. Though he was denied a martyrs death, he was regarded during his lifetime a saint and many miracles were attributed to him.. The most famous one is the story of his host, when looking through the window, seeing St. Anthony holding the Child Jesus in his arms. He is called St. Anthony of Padua on account of his log residence in that city.

Almighty God, You have given St. Anthony to Your people as an outstanding preacher and a ready helper in time of need. With his assistance may we follow the Gospel of Christ and experience Your help in every difficulty. Amen.

ORDINARY TIME

We have now resumed the liturgical season called Ordinary Time. There is nothing ordinary about Ordinary Time, but it tells us that the weeks are listed by ordinal numbers. First, second and up to Thirty Fourth Sunday week of Ordinary Time. At the end of Advent and the Christmas season we start counting the Sundays by ordinal numbers. Ordinary Time is soon interrupted by the Lenten and Easter seasons and resumes right after Pentecost and ends with the celebration of Christ the King, after which the new liturgical year begins with the first Sunday of Advent.

Ordinary Time is the longest season in which we hear about Jesus' words and deeds. His great love for us, His miracles, His forgiveness extended to sinners. Jesus taught with authority, which means teaching by example. We hear Him inviting us to follow Him and to act like Him. Therefore at the end of the ordinary time, we realize, we know, that He is; Christ is King.
