In their old age they came from Galilee to settle in

Jerusalem, and there the Blessed Mother of God was born and reared. Mary was probably their only child. They died and were buried in Jerusalem and a church was build on the site of their home in the 4th century, possibly by St. Helena

Lord, God of our fathers, You gave Saint Joachim and Saint Anne the privilege of being the parents of Mary, the mother of Your incarnate Son. May their prayers help us to attain the salvation You have promised to Your people. Amen.

SAINT MARTHA

Disciple of the Lord. Patroness of housewives, waiters and cooks



Martha was the sister of Mary and Larzarus John tells us in his Gospel, that Jesus loved them. It was Martha who received Jesus

into their house and it was she who served the guests while her sister Mary sat at the Lord's feet listening to His teaching. St. Martha is a model of hospitality. It was Martha who went to meet Jesus when he returned to Bethany to raise her dead brother Larzarus and confessed her belief that Jesus was the Christ, the Son of God. Legend tells us, that after the Ascension of Jesus, the enemies of Christianity put Martha, Mary and Larzarus aboard a ship without sails or oars. Divine Providence guided the ship to the eastern shores of France. Larzarus became Bishop of Marseilles, Mary a hermit and Martha, ever faithful to Jesus Christ, the foundress of a group of pious women performing charitable works.

Father, Your Son honoured Saint Martha by coming to her home as a guest. By her prayers may we serve Christ in our brothers and sisters and be welcomed by You into heaven, our true home. Amen

SAINT IGNATIUS OF LOYOLA Patron of retreats and soldiers

Ignatius was born in 14 into an ancient noble family of Loyola in northern Spain. In his youth he served as a page to King Ferdinand of Spain and later became a brave and popular soldier in

the service of the Duke of Najera, a relative of his. In summer 1521, defending the unfinished citadel of Pamplona against an invading army, Ignatius was wounded, and left him, after several operations lame. During a long convalescence, it was the Will of God, that Ignatius, having little else to do, came across the Life of

Jesus and a volume of the Life of Saints. Strongly moved, he was inflamed with the desire to serve Jesus. He began a new way of life, sought shelter in the hospice of St. Lucy in Manresa, and lived a life of poverty, prayer and serving the poor. At Manresa communicated through mystical experiences God and illuminations. A spiritual fire had enkindled in Ignatius' heart for the salvation of souls. At the age of 33 he knew more education was necessary. Not to confine his studies to Spain alone, he went to Paris to complete his studies. He clearly saw that a new Order was needed and together with Francis Xavier, James Lainez, Peter Favre, Simon Rodriguez and others the founded the Society (Company) of Jesus, known to us as the Jesuits. 1538 Ignatius was ordained. He laboured unceasingly for the salvation of souls. In 1556, at the age of 65 he died with the words "Jesus, Jesus" in his lips. Pope Gregory XV canonized him in 1622. The Jesuit Order is important to us since it was the Jesuit missionaries that recorded our early history.

Father, You gave Saint Ignatius of Loyola to Your Church to bring greater glory to Your name. May we follow his example on earth and share the crown of life in heaven. Amen.
