SAINT JOHN MARY VIANNEY Patron of Priests

This French priest is universally known as the "Cure of Ars". He was born 1786 near Lyons, France. His parents were respectable, pious farmers. John often said that he owed all his holiest impressions to his deeply religious mother. Even as young child prayer was his



delight and his mother saw his extraordinary devotion and wished for her son to become a priest. As 8 year old John was given charge of the cows and sheep on his father's farm. The French Revolution closed their parish church and so John prayed in the fields. After the Revolution John studied for the priesthood and was ordained in 1815. Three years later he was made parish priest in the little village of Ars-en-Dombes.

St. John Mary Vianney was a wonderworker loved by the crowds, but he retained his childlike simplicity, a true priest after the Heart of Christ. His days were filled with works of charity and love, he healed and converted and had time for everybody who came to him. He heard confessions 12 to 16 hours each day. Walking from the confessional to the rectory, pilgrims would be eager to touch him, cut pieces from his clothing and even his hair. When he died on August 4<sup>th</sup>, 1859 at the age of 73, John Vianney had already the reputation of being a Saint. Saint Pius X beatified him in 1905, and Pope Pius XI canonized him in 1925. In 1929, only 70 years after his death he was named Patron Saint of parish priests. This year Pope Benedict XVI declared this the "Year for Priests" to go coincide with the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the death of St. John Mary Vianney and during this special year our Holy Father will declare St. John Mary Vianney patron of **all** priests of the world.

Almighty and merciful God, You made Saint John Vianney outstanding in his priestly zeal and concern for Your people. By his example and prayers, enable us to win our brothers and sisters to the love of Christ and come with them to eternal glory. Amen.

## August 7<sup>th</sup>

#### ST. SIXTUS II AND COMPANIONS

St. Sixtus was elected to the Roman See in 257 at the height of the Valerian persecution. He was known as a good and peace loving Pontiff. Only

12 months after becoming Pope, on August 6<sup>th</sup>, he was surprised while celebrating Mass at the Cemetery of Pretextatus. Sixtus was arrested, taken to court, convicted and brought back to the cemetery to be beheaded on his own Episcopal throne. On the way to his martyrdom St. Sixtus met St. Lawrence who at seeing his bishop being taken to his death, wanted to go with him. Sixtus comforted him by prophesying a "more beautiful crown for him" Six of the Pope's companions where martyred on the same day, St. Lawrence 3 days later.

Almighty God, You gave St. Sixtus and his companions the grace to lay down their lives for Your word and as a witness to Christ. By the power of the Holy Spirit, help us to be quick to believe and unwavering in the profession of our Faith. Amen.


