BAPTISM OF THE LORD

STS. JULIAN AND BASILISSA

Saints Julian and Basiliss, though married, lived in perpetual chastity by mutual consent.

They turned their home in Egypt into a hospital in order to help the poor and the sick. Basilissa cared for the women and Julian took care of the men. At times the housed a thousand destitute people. Basilissa died after suffering severe persecution. Julian received his crown of martyrdom during the reign of Maximin II in 313 many years after Basilissa did. There are many churches in the East and West bearing one or the other of these Martyrs. During the time of St. Gregory the Great, (6th century) St. Julian's scull was brought from the East to France and given to Queen Brunehault; she gave it to the convent which she founded. Later part of the scull was presented to the monastery of Morigny and part to the church of the Regular Canonesses of Balilissa in Paris.

January 12th

SAINT MARGUERITE BOURGEOYS

Marguerite was born in Troyes, France in 1620. She was the sixth of twelve children. She sought to enter the religious life when she was twenty years old, but for some reason was rejected by



both the Carmelites and the Poor Clair's. On the advice of a priest she formed a group of "extern Sisters" with other young women. They taught children in poor districts in Troyes. This was however discouraged by the religious authorities. Her opportunity to follow her missionary calling came in 1653, when the French settlement of Ville-Marie, now Montreal, was in need of a school mistress. In October 1653 she was at her post, where she was looking after children, worked in hospitals, assisted couples preparing for marriage introduced vocational courses and so became the soul of the settlement. In 1570 she went back to France to inspire more young women to teach in the new world. She with fellow teachers formed the Congregation of Notre Dame. They worked wherever they were needed. Today members of the community she formed work in many parts of the world. Marguerite was canonized in 1982.



THE SYNOD ON SYNODALITY:

Pope Francis has launched the Synod on Synodality, an ambitious two-year global process of listening to the faithful. "Synod" comes from an ancient Greek

word meaning "walking together on the road." There have been many synods in the history of the Church, but these have traditionally been opportunities for bishops to come together to determine the path forward for the Church.

With the Synod on Synodality, Pope Francis is asking every Catholic to help discern what the Holy Spirit is telling us at this moment as the Church enters its third millennium.

The first phase of the Synod on Syndodality will last through the first half of 2022 and will see the world's faithful sharing their thoughts at a diocesan level. All those diocesan-level responses will be collected and summarized. Then the bishops of Canada will meet to discuss what they heard in their respective dioceses, followed by larger multinational meetings and, ultimately, culminating in a synod of bishops in the Vatican in 2023. ******************


