SAINT JOHN BOSCO Priest. Patron of Editors

St. John Bosco was born on a poor farm near Turin, Italy, in 1815. As a very young child he helped by

tending sheep. At the age of nine he expressed the desire to become a priest. It was not easy, but the family gave John the education needed to become a priest. The day before St. John Bosco entered the seminary, his mother seeing her son in his clerical dress said to him:" To see you dressed in this manner fills my heart with joy. But remember that it is not the dress that hives you honor, but the practice of virtue. If at any time you come to doubt your vocation, I beseech you, lay it aside at once. I would rather have a poor peasant for my son than a negligent priest." This "Apostle of Youth" founded the Salesian Society of St. Francis and the daughters of Mary Help of Christians. Today the motto on the Salesian coat of arms: "Give me only souls and keep all the rest," bears witness to the fidelity of Don Bosco to the words of a truly Christian mother. His life's work was consecrated to the care of young boys and girls. He died in 1888 and was canonized in 1934.

Lord, You called John Bosco to be a teacher and father to the young. Fill us with love like his: may we give ourselves completely to Your service and to the salvation of all. Amen.



February 2nd THE PRESENTATION OF THE LORD

This feast is also known as the Purification of the Blessed Virgin, and Candlemas Day.

According to the Law of Moses a mother had to be purified forty days after giving birth. Being

righteous Mary and Joseph went to the Temple of Jerusalem for Mary to be purified and to present Jesus to the Lord and offered a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons as the Law of Moses required. It had been revealed, by the Holy Spirit, to a man by the name of Simeon, that he would not die before he had seen the Messiah. The Holy Spirit led Simeon to the Temple as Jesus was presented to the Lord. He took Jesus into his arms and proclaimed that now the Lord is dismissing him, because he had seen the Lord's salvation. Then Simeon blessed the Holy Family and told Mary that a sword will pierce her own soul too.

Almighty and ever-living God, on this day Your only Son was presented in the Temple as sharing in our human nature. We humbly ask that we too may be presented to You with purified intentions. Amen.

SAINT BLAISE

Bishop, Martyr, Patron of those with throat diseases, wool-combers and wild animals.

Virtually nothing is known with certainty about St. Blaise. It is believed, that he studied

st. Blaise. It is believed, that he studied philosophy and later became a physician. In his profession as physician he witnessed many miseries of life and resolved to spend his life in God's service Known is that, after the death of the Bishop of Sebaste, in Armenia, St. Blaise was appointed bishop. Legend has it that in order to escape persecution under Licinius he took refuge in a cave and lived with wild animals, which he cured of various ailments. St. Blaise was found, seized and taken to prison to be interrogated. On his way to prison a mother, whose child suffered from a disease of the throat implored his aid. At his intersession the child was cured. It is said that St. Blaise promised that anyone who lit a taper in his memory would be free of infection. (Hence the two tapers in the form of a cross when the priest blesses throats) According to legend St. Blaise had been put to death by having his flesh torn by metal wool combs and so died a martyr's death.

Lord, hear Your people through the intercession of Saint Blaise. Help us to enjoy peace in this life and find a lasting refuge in the next. Amen.


