SAINTS PAUL MIKI AND COMPANIONS Martyrs



In 1597, forty-five years after St. Francis Xavier had evangelized much of Japan, St. Paul Miki and twenty-five others were martyred. Those martyred were three Japanese Jesuits: Paul Miki, John Goto, James Kisai; Six Franciscans, four of whom were Spanish: Peter Baptist, Martin de Aguirre, Francis Blanco, Francis of St. Michael; one Mexican: Philip de las Casas, and one Indian, Gonsalo Garcia; the other seventeen were Japanese lay people, including a soldier, physician and altar boys. All were pierced with a lance like their Savior.

ST. JOSEPHINE BAKHITA

St. Josephine Bakhita was born into a large and loving family in western Sudan, as a member of the Daju tribe. When she was 7 or 8 years old she was kidnapped at gun-point by a pair of slavetraders. Her older sister had been kidnapped two years earlier. When asked her name she could not answer so one of her captors dubbed her, sarcastically Bakhita, which means "lucky one".



She and another girl were taken to the slave market, but managed to escape. They were captured and after a long forced march eastward were sold to an Arab chief, whose daughters were quite kind to her, but the son beat her unconscious, from which she took a month to recover. She then was sold to a Turkish army general, were she was mistreated by his mother and wife. She was tattooed with about 140 cuts on the chest, belly and arms into which they rubbed salt to keep the wounds open, a traditional mark of ownership. Some 3 years later Bakhita was purchased by the Italian consul who freed her and employed her as maid. Now she was treated more kindly. Late in 1884 the consul escaped from Khartoum with his family and Bakhita asked to be taken with them. Bakhita was given to a friend of the consul and she became nanny to his daughter. In 1889 she was introduced to the Christian faith by the family's business administrator. He gave her a crucifix and began telling her about Jesus. On January 9, 1890 Bakhita was baptized, taking the name Josephine, received Holy Communion for the first time and was confirmed. Three years later she joined the Canossian Sisters in Venice as novice and was professed in 1896, after being examined by the new cardinal who later became Pope Pius X. She became known for her kindness and goodness. She was called "Little Brown Mother". She spent the years of the Second World War in Schio, were the nuns were convinced that her saintly presence protected them from bombing. She died on February 8, 1947 of pneumonia, was beatified in 1992 and canonized October 1, 2000.

Lord, our help and guide, make Your love the foundation of our lives. May our love for You express itself in our eagerness to do good. Amen

The miraculous and indisputable cures, which have taken place at the place of Mary's appearance, made Lourdes a place of great devotion, a devotion which spontaneously sprang up to Our Lady of Lourdes all over the world.

Holy Mary, ever Immaculate Virgin, Mother of Mercy, Health of the sick and Refuge of sinners. You revealed yourself to Bernadette

as the Immaculate Conception and made the place of your appearance a place where you dispense your favors. Heal us poor sinners from our spiritual and corporal infirmities. Help us to imitate your virtues so we may grow closer to your Son Jesus Christ.
