SAINTS PERPETUA AND FELICITY Martyrs

St. Perpetua was a 22 year old noble lady of Carthage with a baby son and St. Felicity was a married slave who was pregnant. They and 3 fellow Christians were arrested under the anti-



Christian edict of the year 202. All had been converted by a layman, Saturus, who joined them voluntarily in the dungeon where they were imprisoned for refusing to sacrifice to the gods. Perpetua yielded her child to her father but remained firm in her Faith. Felicity gave birth in prison. She also remained steadfast in the Faith even when her baby was taken away from her.

St. Perpetua, St. Felicity and Saturninus, Secundulus Revocatus and Saturus, their teacher, were condemned to death. They were mauled by beasts in the amphitheater before finally being beheaded.

Father, inspired by Your love Saints Perpetua and Felicity were able to disregard persecution and overcome the torment of death. Aided by their prayers, may we make contestant progress in our love for You. Amen.

SAINT JOHN OF GOD Patron of Hospitals and the Sick

John was born in Portugal on March 8, 1495 of humble but virtuous parents. His early years were spent as a shepherd. 1522 he enlisted in a military company. Evil associations caused

his spirit of piety to decline. Wracked by guilt over his wasted life, he sought the counsel of John of Avila, a preacher and missionary, who helped him find a new purpose in life. John of God dedicated himself to the care of the sick and the poor. Others joined him and they became known as the Order of Brothers Hospitallers or Brothers of St. John of God. John died on his birthday in 1550 and was canonized in 1690.

God You filled St. John with the spirit of compassion. Grant that we also live by Your commandment of love. Amen.

March 9th

SAINT FRANCES OF ROME Patroness of widows.

St. Frances was born in Rome in 1384 into a noble family. She wished to enter a convent at the age of twelve, but obediently,



according to the wishes of her parents, she married a wealthy nobleman by the name Lawrence Ponziani. In marriage she led a pious life, but never let her spiritual exercises interfere with her domestic duties. She endured many trials. She bore 3 children, of which 2 died in infancy. During the great schism her husband was banished. She however suffered with exemplary patience blessing the will of God. She looked after others who were grieving and looked after their needs. After the schism her husband recovered his estates. In 1424 she founded the Oblate Congregation of Tor di Specchi, to which she gave the rule of St. Benedict. In 1437, after the death of her husband she received the habit and began to live as if she was the lowest of all the sisters, still she was chosen mother superior. She died March 9th, 1440, at the age of 56 and was canonized in 1608. God, in St. Francis You have given us a singular example of both the monastic and the conjugal way of life. Help us to persevere in serving You so that in all circumstances of life we may look at You and follow You. Amen.


our Holy Mother by praying the Holy Rosary. Come and join us.

THE LORD IS KIND AND MERCIFUL.



<u>1.) JESUS IS CONDEMNED TO DEATH.</u> Consider how Jesus, having been scourged and crowned with thorns, is unjustly condemned by Pilate to death on the Cross

2.) JESUS TAKES UP HIS CROSS. Consider how Jesus, bearing this cross on His shoulders, offers His suffering to the Father for us.

<u>3.) JESUS FALLS FOR THE FIRST TIME.</u> Consider this first fall, Jesus, bleeding, crowned with thorns, so weak He can hardly walk, yet forced to carry this heavy burden. The soldiers strike Him and He falls.

<u>4.) JESUS MEETS HIS MOTHER.</u> Consider this meeting between mother and son Their tender love for one another, their hearts torn asunder.

5.) SIMON OF CYRENE HELPS JESUS CARRY HIS CROSS. Consider how the torturers force the bystander Simon to carry Jesus's cross. They want Jesus to stay alive long enough to be crucified.

<u>6.) VERONICA WIPES JESUS' FACE.</u> Consider how Veronica recognizes Jesus' pain and attempts to lessen His sufferings

7.) JESUS FALLS FOR THE SECOND TIME. Consider this second fall. It reopens His wounds, hurts His head and pains His whole body.

<u>8.) JESUS SPEAKS TO THE WOMEN OF JERUSALEM.</u> Consider how these compassionate women wept at the sight of the tortured Jesus

<u>9.) JESUS FALLS FOR THE THIRD TIME.</u> Consider this third fall. Through extremely weak, Jesus is urged on by the soldiers.

10.) JESUS IS STRIPPED OF HIS GARMENTS. Consider the violence with which the soldiers tear off the bloody garments which cling ti His broken skin and start the wounds bleeding again.

11.) JESUS IS NAILED TO THE CROSS. Consider how Jesus, arms extended on the cross, offers to His Father the ultimate sacrifice for our salvation

<u>12.</u>) **JESUS DIES ON THE CROSS.** Consider how Jesus, after hours of agony and anguish on the cross, abandons Himself to the Father and dies.

13.) JESUS IS TAKEN DOWN FROM THE CROSS. Consider how two disciples take the broken body down from the cross and place Jesus in His grieving mother's arms.

14.) *JESUS IS LAID IN THE TOMB.* Consider how the disciples filled with grief, carry the body to the burial place. They close the tomb and come confused and sorrowful.
