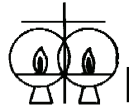

THE BEHEADING OF ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST

St. John the Baptist was chosen by God to be the "Forerunner of the Messiah". His mother was the cousin of Mary, the Mother of Jesus. After reaching manhood St. John led a penitential and holy life for many years in the desert. It was he who pointed out Jesus to the people by the Sea of Galilee and baptized Jesus. It was he who told Herod that by taking his brother's wife Herodias, he defied divine and human laws. For this reproof Herod imprisoned St. John. About a year later Herod celebrated his birthday at which Herodias' daughter Salome danced. Her dance pleased Herod and he swore to give her anything she wanted. At the advice of her daughter Salome asked for the head of St. John the Baptist on a platter. Having made the oath, even so it was a sinful one, Herod ordered to have St. John beheaded. Jesus called St. John, His Forerunner, the greatest among those born of women.



God our Father, You called John the Baptist to be the herald of Your Son's birth and death. As he gave his life in witness to truth and justice, so may we strive to profess our faith in You. Amen.

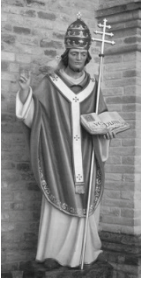
August 31st

ST. AIDAN

Patron of one of our elementary schools.



St. Aidan was a great missionary of Northern Britain. He was either of Irish origin or was actually born in Ireland. He came to England at the request of St. Oswald, king of Northumbria, who had asked the monks of Iona to send him a bishop and assistants for the work of conversion. St. Aidan, actually the second choice, was a man of outstanding gentleness, holiness and moderation. He was consecrated bishop and proved to be the better choice; even so Oswald had to translate from his Gaelic for some time. St. Oswald gave St. Aidan the island of Lindisfarne, where he, with the help of his Irish followers, proclaimed the Word of God. King Oswald gave them land to build churches and monasteries and noble and simple were instructed in the Christian faith. St. Aidan and his followers lived as they taught. St. Aidan gave away all money he was given to the poor. He took an especial interest in the ransoming of slaves. Many of those freed became his disciples. Oswald was killed by the pagan king Penda of Mercia and was succeeded, in the Northern Province, by Oswy and the southern part St. Oswin, a humble king, who protected St. Aidan as well as he could but Oswy eventually ordered St. Aidan killed. On August 31st, 651 St. Aidan died after he had been bishop for 16 years. His body was taken to Lindisfarne to be buried in the monk's cemetery. Later a church was build where his remains rest at the right side of the Altar. He was a man of peace, love, purity and humility; he was above anger, greed and despised pride and conceit.



September 3rd
SAINT GREGORY THE GREAT
Patron of Teachers

St. Gregory was born at Rome about the year 540. He was the son of a wealthy senator and after acquiring the usual thorough education, Emperor Justin the Younger appointed him Chief Magistrate of Rome, when he was only 34 years of age. After the death of his father he build six monasteries in

Sicily and a seventh in his own house in Rome. Here he himself assumed the monastic habit in 575. In 578 he was ordained deacon and was sent to Constantinople as papal ambassador. In the year of 586 he was recalled to Rome to become abbot of his monastery. 592, after the death of Pelagius, St Gregory was unanimously elected pope. He fed starving Romans, was just towards his tenants, protected the rights of Jews, his was political diplomatic and he maintained contact with all the Churches of Christendom. All this helped earn him the title "Great". St. Gregory is credited with developing the "Gregorian Chants", but this has been disputed. This great pope died in 604. He is a Doctor of the Church.

God, You look upon Your people with compassion and rule them with love. Through the intercession of Pope St. Gregory, give wisdom to the leaders of Your Church. Amen.

Mary, Mother of God, and mother of us all, do not cease to pray for us sinners. Help us to serve Jesus, your Son and our Lord, as He deserves. Assist us in all our needs and do not abandon us at the hour of death. Amen

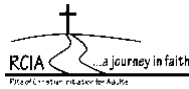

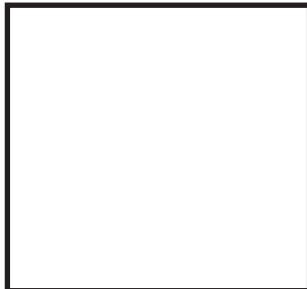
**RCIA – RIGHT OF CHRISTIAN
