ST.MOTHER TERESA OF CALCUTTA

Gonxha (Agnes) Bojaxhill, lovingly known to the world as Mother Teresa of Calcutta, was born August 26th, 1910 in Skopje, Macedonia. Her parents Nikola and Drane were of Albanian decent. Gonxha received first Holy Communion at the age of five and was confirmed 3 months after her 6th birthday. When eight years of age her father died. Drane raised her children firmly and lovingly and influenced her daughter’s vocation. In September 1918 Gonxha left to follow God’s call to become a missionary. She joined the Sisters of Loreto in Dublin, Ireland. There she received the name “Teresa”. After a few months of training in Dublin she departed for India and arrived in Calcutta on January 6th, 1929. She was assigned to teach at St. Mary’s School for girls. Sister Teresa made her Final Profession of Vows on May 24th, 1937, becoming, as she said, the spouse of Jesus for all eternity. In 1946 traveling by train from Calcutta to Darjeeling for her annual retreat, by that time known as “Mother Teresa” she received her “call within a call”. She never explained how, Jesus revealed to her His pain at the neglect of the poor and that He wanted her to establish a religious community to look after the poor, sick and unwanted. With permission, Mother Teresa established the Missionaries of Charity. On August 17th, 1948, she dressed for the first time in a white, blue-bordered sari and left her beloved Loreto convent to go and be with the poorest of the poor. She received, the Nobel Peace prize in 1970, which she received “for the glory of God and in the name of the poor”. Mother Teresa’s earthly life came to an end September 5th, 1997. She was beatified by Pope John Paul II in October 2003. She was canonized September 4th, 2016.

BIRTH OF THE VIRGIN MARY

It is not certain where Mary was born. According to ancient writers she was born near Jerusalem, but the little Galilean village of Nazareth is also mentioned in tradition, may be because it was there where the Angel Gabriel told Mary that she would conceive and bring forth a Son. As tradition tells us Mary was born to a holy couple of the royal house of David, whose names were Joachim and Anne. Joachim and Anne were already far advanced in years, when God blessed them with Mary, their first child. Their daughter would be forever blessed among women. No stain of sin ever marred her beautiful soul. It was she who was chosen by God to be the Mother of Jesus Christ, who would redeem and save the world. This Feast in honour of the Virgin Mary originated in Jerusalem in the 5th century.

God, give Your servants heavenly grace, so that as the Birth of the Blessed Virgin Mary marked the beginning of salvation, this feast of her nativity may serve to obtain peace for the world. Amen.



September 9th

SAINT PETER CLAVER

Patron Saint of Colombia.

Peter was born June 1581 at Verdu in the Spanish province of Catalonia to parents who, though impoverished, were both descended from ancient and distinguished families. His deeply devout parents consecrated Peter at birth to God. At the age of 20 Peter Claver became a Jesuit. While Peter studied philosophy his attention was directed to the needs of those in the New World. In 1610 he left for the New World and landed in Cartagena, Colombia. In March 1616 Peter Claver was ordained Priest in New Granada, Colombia. Cartagena was the principal slave market for the New World. Every month 1000 slaves arrived from Africa. Countless atrocities were inflicted on these slaves. It was to these poor, deeply afflicted human beings that Peter Claver devoted his life to. Nearly 40 years he served as their apostle, father, physician and friend. He fed them and nursed them with great tenderness. God so blessed his labour, that he was able to baptize forty thousand African slaves. Peter Claver died September 8th, 1654. When the news of his death reached the Slaves they cried "The Saint is dead". Many miraculous cures attested the sanctity of this great servend of God and mankind. He was canonized by Pope Leo XIII in 1888, who gave him the title "Slave of Slaves".

Almighty God and Father, You gave St. Peter Claver the courage and holiness. He devoted his life and served the poorest of Your children, showing compation and giving them spiritual guidance. Help us, through Peter Claver's intercession, to become caring neighbours to our less fortunate brothers and sisters. Amen.
