Prayer Before Reading the Bible

"Father, anoint me with your Holy Spirit,

so that as I read your eternal word, your word may penetrate my whole being and transform me.

Grant me the blessing to be a faithful disciple

in believing the Word of God and that I may be a light shining upon all who are in darkness. Amen."

"Before reading the Bible, Catholics often say a prayer asking God for help. This prayer asks for the Holy Spirit to guide us. We are asking God to make us open and ready to listen. Through this prayer, we ask that His Word touches us deeply. We ask that God helps us to understand and live by what we read.

The Bible is not just an old book. Catholics believe it is God's living Word. When we read the Bible with an open heart, God speaks to us through it. Prayer helps us prepare for this. By saying this prayer before reading, we set aside our distractions and become ready to listen. We are asking God to open our minds and hearts to what He wants to say.

If you are new to reading the Bible, you may find it helpful to have a method. One way is Lectio Divina, which is a simple, step-by-step way to pray with Scripture. Another way is to use your imagination by picturing yourself in the scene you are reading. This is often called Ignatian Contemplation. Both methods can make us more receptive to God's Word. Prayer before reading is the first step in being truly open to His guidance.

This prayer before reading the Bible is simple but important. We ask for the Holy Spirit's help to understand what we are reading. We pray to be faithful in living out God's Word and sharing it with others. It is a reminder that we need God's help to fully receive His Word. This short prayer helps us connect to God before we read, helping us to be ready to hear and respond to His message."

Connecting Scripture and Spirit

"This prayer before reading the Bible is rooted in themes found in Scripture and in Catholic teachings. In the Bible, Jesus often speaks of the Holy Spirit as a helper and guide. He promises the Spirit to His disciples to lead them into truth (John 16:13). The Catechism of the Catholic Church echoes this idea, saying, "Sacred Scripture must be read and interpreted in the light of the same Spirit by whom it was written" (CCC 111). This prayer asks the Holy Spirit to help us understand God's Word, making it a natural way to follow what Jesus taught about seeking God's guidance.

In Catholic catechesis, we learn that the Bible is a special way God speaks to us. Praying before reading helps us respect the Bible as God's message, not just another book. This practice also teaches that we need the Holy Spirit's help to fully understand Scripture. For youth, this prayer introduces the idea that God's Word is alive and has something to say to each of us personally. It shows them how to approach Scripture with a sense of openness and readiness.

Using this prayer before reading the Bible can help young people form a habit of listening to God's voice in their lives. It encourages them to go deeper in their faith by seeing Scripture as a source of guidance and inspiration. In this way, the prayer is a step toward helping youth grow closer to God and understand His Word more fully."
