REFLECTION ON THE 4th SUNDAY OF LENT YEAR C

Excerpts from FOUND ALIVE AGAIN by Scott Hahn

"In today's First Reading, God forgives "the reproach" of the generations who grumbled against Him after the Exodus. On the threshold of the promised land, Israel can with a clean heart celebrate the Passover, the feast of God's firstborn son (see Joshua 5:6-7; Exodus 4:22; 12:12-13).

Reconciliation is also at the heart of the story Jesus tells in today's Gospel. The story of the Prodigal Son is the story of Israel and of the human race. But it is also the story of every believer.

In Baptism, we're given a divine birthright, made "a new creation," as Paul puts it in today's Epistle. But when we sin, we're like the Prodigal Son, quitting our Father's house, squandering our inheritance in trying to live without Him.

Lost in sin, we cut ourselves off from the grace of sonship lavished upon us in Baptism. It is still possible for us to come to our senses, make our way back to the Father, as the prodigal does.

But only He can remove the reproach and restore the divine sonship we have spurned. Only He can free us from the slavery to sin that causes us—like the Prodigal Son—to see God not as our Father but as our master, One we serve as slaves.

God wants not slaves but children. Like the father in today's Gospel, He longs to call each of us "My son," to share His life with us, to tell us: "Everything I have is yours."

The Father's words of longing and compassion still come to His prodigal children in the Sacrament of Penance. This is part of what Paul today calls "the ministry of reconciliation" entrusted by Jesus to the Apostles and the Church.

Reconciled like Israel, we take our place at the table of the Eucharist, the homecoming banquet the Father calls for His lost sons, the new Passover we celebrate this side of heaven. We taste the goodness of the Lord, as we sing in today's Psalm, rejoicing that we who were dead are found alive again."

Facts about Palliative Care, Conscience Rights, and Faith-based Health Care Facilities

Palliative Care

END-OF-LIFE CARE



- Palliative care:**
- Can be offered in the home or in a hospice setting.
 - Offers a supportive environment for loved ones caring for a sick relative.
 - Affirms life and views dying as a normal process. It neither hastens nor prolongs death.

Studies have shown that those close to death often fear pain and loneliness. Palliative care helps control pain and provides patients with a loving, caring environment.



There is great concern that euthanasia proponents are now advocating that palliative care facilities should offer euthanasia/assisted suicide on their premises.

Only 30% of Canadians have access to quality palliative care

Conscience Rights



June 2016: Euthanasia/Assisted Suicide legalized in Canada

- Federal government passed legislation
- Provinces oversee local conditions

Ontario remains one of the few jurisdictions worldwide that forces a doctor or nurse to provide a referral for assisted death.



For health care professionals opposed to euthanasia/assisted suicide, performing the procedure or referring for it is equally problematic.



The Canadian Charter of Rights & Freedoms identifies freedom of conscience and religion as fundamental freedoms.



Health care professionals will never abandon patients – there are clear paths forward to balance the rights of both patients and doctors/nurses.

Faith-based Facilities



Many faith-based facilities do not wish to participate in euthanasia/assisted suicide. These facilities were founded on the principle of saving patient lives, not ending them.



Faith-based hospitals will not abandon patients who seek assisted death. They can arrange for a transfer of care to another appropriate facility.



Euthanasia advocates are pressing government to force these facilities to participate in ending the lives of their patients.



No hospital or facility offers every procedure. Why should they be forced to offer euthanasia/assisted suicide?
